Good afternoon 11/15/21- 2nd of the TriMet meetings, this meeting is being recorded

Starting with introductions, name, pronouns, and organization

Joined by Dr Lewis and Sam Desue Jr, TriMet's general manager

Meeting goals from Marissa- micro grant program- timeframe for solicitation. The group proposed no other goals for the meeting outside of the agenda.

October meeting minutes were approved with one edit- "If the committee identifies a training need, will TriMet will be able to implement it across staff and contracted staff. – The answer is YES"

GM Sam Desue welcomed everyone to the advisory committee. Sam gave a brief personal background and assured the committee of the agencies commitment to the work of Reimagining public safety

Dr. Lewis reiterated the roles and responsibilities of the committee, and reminded everyone that the committee information can be found online

John Gardner (see slides) reviewed the Reimagine Public Safety program and explained TriMet's divisions. He reminded the group of the initiative staff are responsible for and the initiatives the committee will have input on. John laid out the next couple of months' worth of committee work including discussing a "crisis intervention team". This discussion prompted great questions around the current state of security at TriMet and regional non police response models.

Mimi Bernal-Graves shared with the committee the LMS tool that will be used to support the implementation of the micro-grants. She spoke about TriMet's commitment to inclusivity and accessibility in trainings and curriculum development. She encouraged the committee to consider the sustainability and maintenance of the material we are requesting. Mimi emphasized different learning styles and best practices in adult learning.

Mimi made herself available for further discussion to the group.
